San Marco – the treasure chest

Tête-à-Tête with death

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What do the composer Igor Stravinsky, the poet Ezra Pound and the dancer Sergei Diaghilev have in common? Partying under the stars

Museum of harmony

Listen to the hits of days long gone as Baroque music fills the air while you explore the exhibition of well-crafted flutes, violas, violins and lutes in the church of *San Maurizio* in the heart of San Marco \rightarrow p. 36

Superlative painting

What is supposedly the largest Baroque ceiling painting in the world is hidden behind the modest brick façade of San Pantalon church – a colossal work put together out of 40 individual canvas elements, freely accessible → p. 57

Stroll through luxurious film sets

The Grand Hotel des Bains on the Lido served as the backdrop for Luchino Visconti's world-famous film adaptation of Thomas Mann's "Death in Venice". The terrace, foyer, restaurants and park still exude this glamorous aura of the past and can be toured discreetly without having to pay a cent → p. 58

Floating icons of the city

Sundowner or dinner at the Rialto

The Venetian carnival is known around the world.
